2) Increase in Total Giving to Moose Charities, excluding amounts for Safe Surfin', Special Olympics, Youth Awareness or other "pass-through" gifts not directly benefiting Mooseheart or Moosehaven, over the fiscal year ended 4/30/2017.

There are other requirements that go with this prestigious award and I won't bore you with the details, but they have now added that a lodge has to conduct six Orientations per year. When you attend orientation, you not only learn about the Moose, Mooseheart and Moosehaven, you meet fellow members who could very well turn out to be lifetime friends.
